Rose Display & Grooming Information

1. Read and follow the Show Schedule carefully.
2. Complete all entry tags clearly.
3. A winning “Show Rose” should be one-half to three-quarters open at judging time.
4. Stem length should be proportional to the size of the bloom.
5. Clean blossom and foliage; remove any debris, insects, fungi, and/or spray residue.
6. All solitary bloom Hybrid Teas (including Climbing Hybrid Teas) must be shown without side buds. Single Hybrid Teas (4-8 petals) can be shown naturally grown, not disbudded.
7. A spray must have at least two blooms and, ideally, should have more.

HORTICULTURE DIVISION

General Rules

1. This show is organized, staged and judged in accordance with the rules of the American Rose Society as set forth in the *Guidelines and Rules for Judging Roses*.
2. To be eligible for entry, rose varieties exhibited must be entered under the approved exhibition name adopted by the American Rose Society as listed in any one of the following official ARS publications. *Modern Roses 12* (book and database), *The Official List of Approved Exhibition Names for Judges and Exhibitors*, *The Handbook for Selecting Roses*, or “Recent Registrations” on the ARS website. In cases where a variety is not listed in the above sources the *Combined Rose List* may be used.
3. Anyone is eligible to submit entries so long as he/she grows the roses in his/her own outdoor private garden. Only one person or team from one garden may enter any one class.
4. Climbing Hybrid Teas, Climbing Grandifloras, Climbing Floribundas, Climbing Minifloras and Climbing Miniatures are shown with their bush form.
5. An exhibitor may enter as many blooms in a class as desired, provided the entries are of different varieties. However, only one entry per class per exhibitor is allowed in the Challenge Section.

General Rules (continued)

6. A Novice exhibitor is anyone who has not won a trophy or an award open to Amateur exhibitors.

7. Entry tags, containers will be provided by the Society except for Classes;
80 - "Miniature & Miniflora Rose in a Bowl",
83 - "Miniature English Box",
84 - "Miniature Rose Bouquet",
86 - "Rose in a Bowl", 89 - "Trailing Rose",
90 - "English Box", 91 - "Rose Bouquet",
92 - "Wine and Roses" and 93 - "Tin Can Derby"

8. The Rose Show will be open for entry of specimens from 7:00 am to 10:00 am on Saturday, October 20, 2018. All entries must remain until 5:00 pm October 20, 2018.

9. All entries in section A, N, and P will be placed in alphabetical order by varietal name. Each variety shall constitute a subclass.

10. Ribbons, certificates and trophies will be awarded, if merited. Only FIRST PLACE WINNERS are eligible for trophies.

11. No exhibitors shall be permitted in the judging area during judging except those duly authorized by the Chairman of Judges and/or approved by the Show Chairman.

General Rules (continued)

12. In accordance with the American Rose Society rules the following may result in disqualification:
 - a. Misnamed, misclassified, misplaced (if placed by the exhibitor), unlabeled specimens.
 - b. Appearance of the exhibitors name any where other than the designated place on the entry tag.
 - c. Stem on stem growth (except on types where it is permitted).
 - d. Any foreign substance applied to foliage, stem or bloom for the purpose of improving its appearance.
 - e. Side buds or side growth sufficiently developed to have formed a stem on a specimen that must be shown disbudded.
 - f. Any specimen in violation of ARS or local show rules.

13. Neither the Sierra Foothills Rose Society nor Green Acres Nursery & Supply will be responsible for loss or damage to any exhibit or personal property of exhibitors.

14. *The decision of the judges is final.*

Point Scores for Judging Specimens

Form:

Elegance, dignity, true to expected form, with well-formed center and symmetrically arranged petals **25 points**

Color:

Typical of the variety shall include freshness, brilliance and purity **20 points**

Substance:

Quality and quantity of matter in the petals. Substance comprises the texture, crispness, firmness, thickness and the toughness of the petals and determines the degree of durability of form and keeping quality of the bloom **15 points**

Stem and Foliage:

Stem to be primary. Foliage should be clean and not damaged by spray or wind..... **20 points**

Size:

Should be typical, neither overgrown or under size **10 points**

Balance and Proportion:

Overall appearance - bloom, stem and foliage should be harmonious **10 points**

PHOTOGRAPHY DIVISION

General Rules

1. This show is open only to amateur photographers.
2. A 5"x7" or 8"x10" color photo taken by the exhibitor. Rose(s) must be the dominant feature of the photo and must be mounted on a 11" x 14" photo board and matted with a pre cut photo mat board of any color.
3. Multiple entries may be submitted, but only one photo of any one variety per exhibitor. Limit 2 entries per person per class.
4. Photo must be labeled with a small Rose Show Tag, attached to the front, upper left corner of each entry. The class and the rose variety or location of the garden shall be visible to the judge. The exhibitor's name shall not be visible on the front of the tag or photo will be disqualified.
5. Photographer need not have grown the subject of the photo.
6. Published photos or photos that have won previous awards are not eligible.
7. The judging will be by both an American Rose Society Judges and a Photographer (if available).
8. First, second and third place will be awarded in each class where warranted. Each class may have several first place winners. Best of Class will be selected from first place winners.

ARTISTIC DIVISION

General Rules

1. A rose or roses must be the dominant flower in all arrangements.
2. All roses must be outdoor grown and should be of high quality.
3. The ARS Approved Exhibition name of all roses in each arrangement must be written on the entry tag.
4. "AG" must be written on the entry tag if roses are arranger grown so that the entry will be eligible for an ARS medal certificate.
5. One entry per exhibitor is allowed in each class, but an exhibitor may enter as many classes as desired. More than one exhibitor from the same garden may enter the same class.
6. Accessories are allowed unless stated otherwise in the schedule.
7. Flowers other than roses, dried and / or treated dried plant material are allowed unless prohibited by the schedule.
8. A card of intent may be included with an arrangement as an explanation of the arranger's theme or class title, unless the schedule specifically forbids this.
9. An arrangement incorrectly placed in a class will be judged in the class in which it is placed.
10. All entries must be the work of the exhibitor.
11. No one but the exhibitor may touch or move an arrangement. However, in special circumstances if all efforts to locate the arranger have failed, the Arrangements Chairman may carefully move the arrangement. Arrangements Chairman reserves the right to remove or replace any wilted plant material or the entire display if necessary after judging.

**ARTISTIC DIVISION
General Rules**

**Infringement of the following rules will
result in severe Penalty:**

- Painted or dyed fresh plant materials and live creatures are not allowed.
- The use of plant materials on the state or local conservation plants list is not permitted.
- The American Flag or flag of any country may not be used in any arrangement or as a decoration in any way.

**There are two causes for disqualification
of an arrangement:**

1. Roses not outdoor grown (i.e. florist roses).
2. Use of artificial plant material.
